### **WATER TRANSFERS BENEFIT REGION**

Two of San Juan's wholesale customer agencies — Fair Oaks Water District and Citrus Heights Water District — increased groundwater production to offset surface water supply they would have received from San Juan. This surface water is being sold to agencies in the San Joaquin Valley. The revenue from the water transfer covers all associated costs. In addition, net revenues generated by the sale will help reduce future rate increases for major infrastructure improvements.

Other agencies in the region who are also providing water transfers include the City of Sacramento and the Carmichael and Sacramento Suburban water districts. The availability and cost of water supplies for San Juan's retail area customers or customers in Citrus Heights, Fair Oaks, Folsom or Orangevale are not negatively impacted by the transfer.

### **SAVING MILLIONS!**

San Juan is always working to save ratepayer dollars and ensure long-term financial stability. For example, San Juan's Board of Directors has approved refinancing bonds originally issued in 2009 which will save the wholesale enterprise about \$11.2 million over the next 20 years. In addition, the Board approved amendments to long-term wholesale contracts that will provide approximately \$4 million more in savings over the next 10 years.
